

ORDINANCE NO. 214

AN AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. 38 AS AMENDED
BY ORDINANCE NO. 103 AND 198 FIXING AND IMPOSING
SEWER RENTS AND CHARGES BY AMENDING SECTION 4
THEREOF.

The Board of Commissioners of Penn Township, York County, Pennsylvania, hereby ordains as follows: That Section 4 of Ordinance No. 38, adopted the eighteenth day of February, 1964, as amended by Ordinance No. 103, adopted the twenty-fifth day of February, 1969, and Ordinance No. 198, adopted the eighteenth day of February, 1976, being Paragraph I and II of Subsection A of Section 110-10, Chapter 110 of the Code, which reads as follows:

SECTION 4: Sewer Rent Rates

A. Single Occupancy or Use (except commercial and industrial establishments). The sewer rent charge for collection and treatment of sanitary sewage from single family dwelling units or from properties used for a single purpose (except commercial and industrial establishments) shall be a quarterly charge, computed as follows:

I. Meter Rates: For properties served with water by the Water Supplier, sewer rents based upon water consumed as determined by the quarterly reading of the Water Supplier as follows:

For the quarter ending February 28, 1976, and for each quarter ending the last day of each February, May, August, and November thereafter:

<u>Quantity of Water Used</u>	<u>Quarterly Rates</u>
First 7,000 gals. or less per quarter	\$10.00 Minimum
Next 18,000 gals. per quarter	70¢ per 1000 gals.
All over 25,000 gals. per quarter	60¢ per 1000 gals.

II. Flat Rates: For properties not served with water by the Water Supplier, a flat quarterly sewer rent of \$14.40 per quarter for the quarter ending February 28, 1976, and for each quarter ending the last day of February, May, August, and November thereafter.

Shall be amended to read as follows:

SECTION 4: Sewer Rent Rates

A. Single Occupancy or Use (except commercial and industrial establishments). The sewer rent charge for collection and treatment of sanitary sewage from single family dwelling units or from properties used for a single purpose (except commercial and industrial establishments) shall be a quarterly charge, computed as follows:

I. Meter Rates: For properties served with water by the Water Supplier, sewer rents based upon water consumed as determined by the quarterly reading of the Water Supplier as follows:

For the quarter ending November 30, 1977, and for each quarter ending the last day of each February, May, August, and November thereafter:

<u>Quantity of Water Used</u>	<u>Quarterly Rates</u>
First 7,000 gals. or less per quarter	\$18.00 Minimum
Next 18,000 gals. per quarter	\$1.25 per 1000 gals.
All over 25,000 gals. per quarter	\$1.10 per 1000 gals.

II. Flat Rates: For properties not served with water by the Water Supplier, a flat quarterly sewer rent of \$26.00 per quarter for the quarter ending November 30, 1977, and for each quarter ending the last day of February, May, August, and November thereafter.

Paragraph (2) of Subsection C of Section 110-10, Chapter 110 of the Code, which reads as follows:

C. Commercial and Industrial Establishments

(2) Commercial or industrial establishments discharging into the sewer system, or into sewers owned by the borough, shall pay for sewage service the quarterly charge computed as provided in Subsection C (1) above plus additional charges, if applicable, computed as provided in § 110-12 hereof, or a quarterly charge of not less than fifty percent (50%) of the highest quarterly bill in the twelve-month period immediately preceding the then current billing period, whichever is higher.

Shall be amended to read as follows:

C. Commercial and Industrial Establishments

(2) Commercial or industrial establishments discharging into the sewer system, or into sewers owned by the borough, shall

pay for the sewage service the quarterly charge computed as provided in Subsection C (1) above plus additional charges, if applicable, computed as provided in § 110-12 hereof, or a quarterly charge of not less than seventy-five percent (75%) of the highest quarterly bill in the twelve-month period immediately preceding the then current billing period, whichever is higher.
