

PENN TOWNSHIP RESIDENTIAL INFORMATION

Due to the requirements of Act 101 of 1988 Penn Township established a recycling program that now includes curbside collection of commingled recyclables and a Recycling Drop-off Center for the collection of newspaper, cardboard and magazines. To promote recycling the Township implemented a Pay-As-You-Throw program for trash collection. The trash collection program is very simple, you purchase only the number of trash bags that you need. Bags can be purchased at the following retailers.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING

Aluminum and Steel Cans

Empty Food, Beverage, Aerosol and Paint Cans **Only.**
Plastic Bottles, Containers and Jugs

Containers Numbered 1-7 with a capacity of one gallon or less **Only.**

Glass Food and Beverage Containers

Clear, Brown and Green Bottles and Jars **Only.**

All Lids Should Be Removed and Disposed of in the Trash

Please do not over fill your bin, use a second container marked "Recycling" for overflow, recyclables must be loose in the container, do not place them in plastic bags.



The Township provides each new home with a recycling bin which is the property of the Township and should remain at that location if you move. Additional or replacement bins can be purchased at the Township office located at 20 Wayne Avenue. If you choose, you can provide your own plastic recycling container, however it must be clearly marked with Township recycling stickers on each side. The stickers are free and can be picked up at the Township office or the Recycling Drop-off Center.

CURBSIDE BULK ITEM PICK-UP

The Township's bulk item pickup program was established to give residents a convenient method to dispose of LARGE bulk items. A good rule of thumb to follow to identify what is NOT a bulk item is, IF IT FITS IN A BAG, IT GOES IN A BAG. Items that are small enough to be placed in a trash bag should not be bundled and placed curbside as a bulk item.

Limit one item per week. Items cannot be placed curbside prior to 24 hours from pickup date.

Arrangements must be made for the pickup of metal items. All other items will be collected on your normal trash collection day.

Call the Township Recycling Drop off Center at 637-1561 to schedule a metal item pickup.

NEWSPRINT, JUNK MAIL, INSERTS: NO PLASTIC BAGS WITH THIS MATERIAL

Deposit into boxes located in the newspaper trailer. Do not leave any newsprint on the floor of the trailer. Must be loose or in brown paper bags or tied. See below for plastic bags.

MAGAZINES: Place your magazines loose into the boxes located in the magazine trailer. Please, no newsprint co-mingled with the magazines.

TELEPHONE BOOKS: Place your phone book loose into the box marked "PHONE BOOKS" located in the newspaper trailer.

EYEGLASSES, HEARING AIDS: Located in the building. Deposit in appropriately marked containers. Only complete eyeglasses and hearing aids.

PLASTIC SHOPPING BAGS: Located in the building, deposit in barrel clearly marked "PLASTIC BAGS". Please, no other type of plastic material!

CORRUGATED AND CARDBOARD: Must be broken down and placed in boxes, brown paper bags or tied. Place in cardboard trailer. The Township accepts both corrugated and cardboard. What's the difference? Below are some examples of each:

CORRUGATED: appliance boxes, moving boxes-

CARDBOARD: shoe boxes, gift boxes, soda cases, cereal boxes, pizza boxes, dry food goods

NO WAXED INSERTS, NO SOILED PIZZA BOXES, AND NO STYROFOAM

CLOTHING AND TEXTILES: Place bagged material in the Community Aid collection bin.

ELECTRONICS: televisions, computers, stereos, microwaves, remote controls, cell phones, vacuums, etc., just about anything with an electric cord. Also accepting ink cartridges.

INK CARTRIDGES

AMERICAN FLAGS: The flags will be disposed of in a dignified manner.

SCRAP METAL: Accept anything the DOES NOT contain refrigerant.

NO DISPOSING OF MATERIAL EXCEPT DURING POSTED HOURS OF OPERATION

Above guidelines strictly enforced. Violators will be subject to fines and penalties as prescribed by Ordinance #434, as amended.

TRASH FACTS

- Only "Township" trash bags will be collected by the hauler.
- Remember to keep your trash bag in a covered leak-free container.
- Bags must be tied shut when set curbside for collection and can't weigh more than 40 lbs.
- Trash should be set curbside **no later than 6:00 am** the day of collection and no sooner than the evening prior to your collection day.
- Bulk **metal** items must be scheduled for collection, call 637-1561.
- Other bulk items can be set out on your normal trash collection day, limit 1 per week.
- A bulk item is an item that will not fit into a trash bag.



CLOTHING AND TEXTILES RECYCLING

The Penn Township Commissioners have an agreement with the Community Aid Thrift Store located in the South Hanover Shopping Center alongside Giant Foods. When you recycle clothing and textiles by depositing them into a Community Aid bin located in the Township, including the Township's recycling drop off center, you are not only helping your neighbors in need, but also supporting the Township's recycling program. You are encouraged to drop your clothing and textiles into one of their light brown clothing collection bins.

FREE RESIDENTIAL DOCUMENT SHREDDING

If you have sensitive or private documents that need to be destroyed, we offer shredding events in the Spring and Fall. The Township hires a company to shred confidential records for residents only at no charge. The shredded material is then recycled. See the Township Newsletter or visit the Township web site for details on the next shredding event. If you can't attend the Township event, OX Paper Tube and Core Inc. located at 331 Maple Avenue, Hanover will accept your material and shred it for free. Call 630-0230 for details.



WASTEWATER AND WATER SERVICE

New homeowners are required to establish a sewer billing account at the Township office located at 20 Wayne Avenue. Sewer usage is billed quarterly in January, April, July and October, at a minimum rate of \$53.00 for 7,000 gallons and \$5.00 for each additional 1,000 gallons of usage. Water service for the Township is provided and billed by the Borough of Hanover, please contact them at 637-3877 to establish water service.

CAN'T WAIT FOR LEAF, LIMB OR BRUSH COLLECTION ???

Penn Township residents can dispose of this material at H&H General Excavating Co. located at 660 Old Hanover Road in Spring Grove. H&H will accept leaves, brush, limbs, tree trunks and any wood product that is unpainted, untreated and free of metal. These products can be brought to their facility 7 days a week during daylight hours free of charge. Call 225-4669 or 225-1479 for details.

RESIDENTIAL BRUSH / LIMB AND LEAF COLLECTION

The Township will collect limb and brush in the Spring and Fall of each year and collect leaves curbside in the fall. Please read the newsletter or visit our website www.penntwp.com for details on how and when to place your material curbside.

LAWN MAINTENANCE



The Township Code states that property owners shall not allow the grass and weeds on their property to grow taller than 10" high. This includes the grass and weeds that grow in and along the roadway, curb and sidewalk areas. The Code also prohibits grass from being deposited onto the street. Please direct the mower discharge back to the yard area or pick up the grass in the street when finished mowing.

THINKING ABOUT YARD SALES?

Keep in mind the requirements for conducting these sales.

One yard sale permit allows the resident to have a maximum of two consecutive days between 7am and sunset Monday through Saturday. No Sunday sales allowed. The cost of a yard sale permit is \$5.00.

A maximum of two permits can be obtained within a six month period. Permits can be combined for a three or four day event.

Signs advertising yard sales cannot be placed on any road signs, including stop signs, speed limit signs, signal light poles, etc. Signs may be taped or tied (not stapled or nailed) to wooden utility poles. Signs on private property or in the public right-of-way may not impair vehicular sight distance.

Signs must provide information on the location of the sale, including street name and number as well as the date(s) of the sale. All signs must be removed immediately following the yard sale. Any sign not promptly removed or which represents a safety hazard will be removed by the Township at the expense of the permittee.

SIGN POLLUTION

The Township has an ordinance controlling and authorizing the placement of signs. The ordinance, which can be found online at our website, requires that a permit be secured for most all signs. But residents are telling us that on weekends there seems to be a proliferation of signs going up advertising sales, new homes, business services, etc. The code department has been notified that they should immediately remove and confiscate any unpermitted sign within the street right-of-way. If the signs are on private property the owners will receive a Notice of Violation. Take a few minutes to make application if you have a sign that needs to go up.

CAN YOU SEE YOUR HOUSE NUMBER?



Highly visible house numbers are essential for emergency response personnel. House numbers need to be a durable light-reflecting material or a color that contrasts with the immediate background. Numbers need to be at least 3" high for residential buildings and at least 5 1/2" for nonresidential uses. Reflective house number signs are available for a charge from the Penn Township Volunteer Emergency Services at 204 Clover Lane. You can contact them at 637-4949.

STREET LIGHTS ARE FOR SAFETY

Penn Township residents who have sidewalk/walkway lights installed on their property are required to have these lights lit from dusk to dawn. There are no exceptions. If your light is inoperable and in need of replacement, please contact the Township office for information of approved lighting poles and fixtures.
