

**RESIDENTIAL LAMPS RECAP  
ORDINANCE 495**

Definition: Lighting fixtures privately installed for the purpose of illuminating sidewalks/walks.

Residential lamps: Lighting fixtures for use in illuminating residential sidewalks and walkways shall be ornamental type and UL approved for use in wet conditions., minimum of **75 watt capacity mercury vapor , 35 watt high pressure sodium (white light source only)**, or **50 watt metal halide** energized through the use of photo electric controls meeting UL approvals for operating under wet conditions.

Lamp housing structure: Cast aluminum, stainless steel or solid brass (brass-plated not acceptable).

Lamp globe: Vandal resistant ultra violet stabilized clear poly carbonate material or non-yellowing acrylic.

Lamp panels: Refractive (prismatic not acceptable) so that light is directed out and downward.

Lighting fixture: Energized at dusk through the use of a UL recognized photo electric control. All other electrical components shall be UL recognized and installed as recommended by respective manufacturer.

Pole: Minimum of seven (7) feet above finish grade. Mounted with lag bolts onto a concrete footer. Direct burial method: pole will be inserted into the footer minimum of 18 inches onto minimum depth specified by manufacturer. Footed dimensions shall be regulated by pole manufacturer. Poles shall be manufactured of aluminum, cast iron, or steel. Poles shall have minimum outside diameter of three (3) inches. Wall thickness shall not be less than 1/8 inch thick.

Pole location: Outside but within five (5) feet of the road right of way.

The respective property owner, heirs, assigns or owners shall pay all energy, operating, repair or replacement costs required or incidental to the perpetual operation and maintenance of the residential light constructed on their property. ***It shall be the responsibility of the property owner to activate and illuminate the residential light daily from sunset to sunrise.*** Failure to operate, maintain, repair and replace a residential street light shall constitute a violation of this ordinance subjecting the respective property owner to penalties as defined elsewhere in this ordinance.

Repealer: ALL ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT OR CONFLICTING WITH THIS ORDINANCE ARE HEREBY REPEALED.
